## **Parent and Participant Agreement**

The Unionville Minor Hockey Association, a member of the Ontario Minor Hockey Association, is run by volunteers who are proud to offer a great hockey program for young people in Markham. Please read the following agreement carefully.

### **All parents and players acknowledge and agree as follows:**

All registration information is submitted to the Ontario Minor Hockey Association automatically to ensure that players are insured. For more information, please see [www.omha.net](http://www.omha.net).

All players will conduct themselves in a sportsman-like manner at all times. Certain hockey infractions, such as checking from behind, are extremely dangerous. Any and all such violations may result in removal from the UMHA, with no refund.

Participation in hockey may carry a risk of injury.

Neither the UMHA nor the Town of Markham will be responsible for any injury, accident or loss of personal property suffered during games, practices, or while traveling to and from games.

All the registration information that is provided regarding this application is true.

My name or my child's name may be published by the UMHA for the purposes of reporting game statistics, i.e. goals and assists.

CSA Approved Equipment is mandatory, including helmets and neck guards. Mouth guards are also an OMHA requirement and must be worn for insurance purposes.

Player(s) in my family may be moved within the house league system for the purpose of team balancing and any such movement may take place subsequent to the initial team creation.

Any type of abuse of team or game officials or any UMHA volunteers, by parents or

players, will not be tolerated. Violations may result in removal from the UMHA, with no refund.

**The UMHA reserves the right to refuse registration to any player in its sole discretion.**

Rules, regulations and by-laws of the Unionville Minor Hockey Association, the Ontario Minor Hockey Association, the Ontario Hockey Federation and Hockey Canada, including but not limited to, the UMHA's Parent's Code of Conduct, must be respected and followed.
